



## Rejuvenation Pruning: List of Shrubs

Scientific Name	Common Name
<i>Abelia</i>	Abelia
<i>Aucuba japonica</i>	Spotted Laurel
<i>Berberis</i> spp.	Barberry
<i>Buddleia davidii</i>	Butterfly Bush (after danger of hard frost)
<i>Callicarpa</i>	Beautyberry (prune down to 12 inches)
<i>Caragana</i> spp.	Peashrub
<i>Caryopteris</i>	Blue Mist Spirea (although best flowering is achieved through annual renewal pruning)
<i>Chaenomelea</i> spp.	Flowering Quince
<i>Cornus</i> spp.	Tartarian, Yellow-Twig and Red-Twig Dogwood
<i>Corylus avellana</i>	Hazel (shrubs only)
<i>Crataegus</i> spp.	Hawthorn
<i>Deutzia</i> spp.	Deutzia
<i>Forsythia</i> spp.	Forsythia
<i>Hebe</i> cultivars	Hebe



## Rejuvenation Pruning: List of Shrubs

Scientific Name	Common Name
<i>Hibiscus syriacus</i>	Rose of Sharon, Shrub Althea
<i>Hypericum</i>	St. John's Wort
<i>Hydrangea arborescens</i> 'Grandiflora'	Smooth Hydrangea, Hills-of-Snow
<i>Hydrangea quercifolia</i>	Oakleaf hydrangea
<i>Kolkwitzia amabilis</i>	Beautybush
<i>Ligustrum</i> spp.	Privet
<i>Lonicera</i> spp.	Honeysuckle
<i>Olearia x haastii</i>	Daisy Bush
<i>Philadelphus</i> spp.	Mockorange
<i>Potentilla</i>	Cinquefoil
<i>Prunus laurocerasus</i>	Cherry Laurel
<i>Prunus lusitanica</i>	Portugal or Portuguese Laurel
<i>Prunus tomentosa</i>	Nanking Cherry
<i>Rhus</i> spp.	Sumac
<i>Salix</i> spp.	Willow (shrubs only)
<i>Sambucus</i> spp.	Elderberry
<i>Spirea prunifolia</i> , <i>S. plenaflora</i> 'Plena' and <i>S. x vanhouttei</i>	Bridalwreath and Vanhoutte spireas



## Rejuvenation Pruning: List of Shrubs

Scientific Name	Common Name
<i>Syringa</i> spp.	Lilac
<i>Viburnum</i> spp.	Viburnum
<i>Vitex</i>	Chastetree (after danger of hard frost)
<i>Weigela</i> spp.	Weigela
